Early Detection of Lung Cancer

a chest X-ray The chest X-ray remains the main diagnostic tool for diagnosing lung cancer and is very sensitive (false negative rate is a few percent) If it is normal you should still refer urgently a patient older than 50 with persistent haemoptysis, stridor or new coarse wheeze, SVCO etc If the X-ray reports consolidation, the clinical

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A simple, valid, numerical score for grading chest x-ray ...

a numerical score for grading chest x-ray (CXR) severity and predicting response to treatment in adults with smear-positive pulmonary TB Methods At a TB clinic in Papua, Indonesia, serial CXRs were performed at diagnosis, 2 and 6 months in 115 adults with smear-positive pulmonary TB Radiographic findings predictive of 2-month sputum

Tests carried out before a planned surgical operation

Chest x-ray A chest x-ray may be carried out to detect any previously unknown disease or infection that would make surgery dangerous A chest x-ray may be required if a patient has a history of smoking, respiratory disease (disease of the airways) or heart disease This ...

Information for you - RCOG

a chest X-ray - this can also identify common problems that could be the cause of your symptoms, such as a chest infection • a CT scan (specialised X-ray) of your lungs • a VQ scan (ventilation/perfusion scan) of your lungs - this involves a drip into a vein in your arm • an ultrasound scan of both your legs if you have any symptoms

Managing chest drains on medical wards

- Once bubbling has stopped, repeat chest x ray to assess lung re-expansion
- If blockage occurs, flush with 10 mL 0.9% saline three times daily
- Contact doctor if patient develops shortness of breath, chest pain, or severe cough
- Pleural effusion
- Chest x ray immediately after insertion
- Drain 15 L of fluid and clamp drain for 2
