5 • Pharmacodynamics- - Once a drug has reached its site of action, pharmacodynamic processes determine the type of response and intensity • Drug must first bind to its specific target site at (RECEPTOR) that may be a chemical, a protein on a cell or in blood or tissue spaces, or on a bacteria or virus (ie, heparin, antibody, leukotriene receptor)

Management of IV Fluids and Electrolyte Balance

- Explain the uses of IV therapy, the role of red and white blood cells, platelets, plasma, and the six major electrolytes in intracellular and extracellular fluid

- Understand the rationale for using/avoiding colloids, crystalloids, blood

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Compensation: Respiratory problem →the kidneys compensate by conserving or excreting HCO₃ Metabolic problem → the lungs compensate by retaining or blowing off CO₂ Also look for mixed respiratory and metabolic problems PaCO₂ or HCO₃ in a direction opposite its predicted direction or not close to predictive value Common Causes of Acid-Base Imbalances
